



The humanitarian crisis in Yemen remains the worst in the world, as 80% of the population that is 24 million of people are in need to food or protection assistances Including 14.3 million of people whom in urgent need for the assistance based on recent publication by OCHA.

The ongoing conflict that the country is witnessing has exposed large percentage of the population to hunger, violence, lack of security and protection, lack of income means and collapsing of WASH system that led to the spread of diseases and epidemics.

Under this hard circumstances, FMF works to provide urgent humanitarian assistance to support food security, enhance livelihoods means, enhance health system, provide protection to the most vulnerable groups, capacity building for local communities to strengthen the local communities and the low income families and to enhance their nutrition and health status, protect them from violence and support their resilience to be with stand against to crisis and recover from their negative impacts.

FMF seeks to expand and increase its humanitarian and developmental interventions, as it wouldn't be feasible for one sector to respond effectively to the current crisis.

FMF has been devoting it's resources to support conducting of assessments and studies, in order to support planning and decision making. Also, FMF is keen on M& E activities, constant development and the capacity building of its staff that is considered as a well qualified staff at different specializations, whom has been working with high professionalism standards to serve the people in need and reduce their suffering.

FMF is working in 53 districts in 8 governorates, in which operations at those locations are supervised and managed by the HQ in Aden and 7 field offices and a total staff of 1791 and 1239 volunteers.

During 2019, a total of **64,106** HHs has benefited from food and cash assistances under WFP and YHF projects. And, **11,840** HHs has benefited from livelihood projects under FAO and IOM projects.

The health and nutrition projects were supported by UNFPA, WHO, UNICEF, WFP and GLRA. the total beneficiaries **991,091** from health services through capacity building of health staff, support health facilities and hospitals by medical equipment and medicines, provide therapeutic nutrition commodities to treat malnutrition, and support RH and PHC services. In addition, **12** communities have benefited from peace building initiative under GCs project YCST alongside other projects at different sectors with NGOs such as DRC and Selah.

FMF seeks to foster partnerships and coordinate all efforts with the different stakeholders including Government, local authorities, UN agencies, INGOs and NNGOs, in order to reduce the humanitarian crisis and enhance the ability to recover in post conflict phase. Also, to focus on identifying the roots of crisis instead of dealing with its consequences with a consideration of international and national dimensions of risk management by connecting peace and development in order to increase the ability of the local communities, vulnerable groups and nutrition and environmental systems to recover and sustain.




















Supplementary Feeding Project








Stay Safe Mama Project



Minimum Service Project

The ongoing conflict in the Al-Dhalea governorate in southern Yemen has produced difficult humanitarian conditions, which have made most of the population of this gonvernorate in need for an urgent assistance. One of the major need is health services that are provided though the public health sector at the governorate, which is witnessing a deterioration in service provision. Several health facilities were closed as a result of the fleeing of the health workers, which has led to deprive the population from accessing life-saving health interventions.

The project seeks to provide access to health care services at all levels in addition to responding to priority health needs and at the same time striving for a rebalancing of the health system in the targeted areas through a minimum package of services that is providing a set of essential care services.




Support Reproductive health services project

Third Surgical Camp of Bone Abnormalities in Chlidren



Supported by the Selah Development Foundation, Field Medical Foundation organized the third surgical camp for orthopedic surgery for children under the age of sixteen, to significantly alleviate the suffering of poor families who sometimes are unable to treat their children due to their difficult financial conditions.









Support and strengthen the national programs for TB and leprosy



As a result of the on going conflict in Yemen and it's implications, several national health programs were subject to neglect including national programs for TB and leprosy. These two diseases considered as major challenges at national and international levels as they are connected to poverty, malnutrition and the risk to develop resistance to the routine treatment of the diseases. Therefore, the project has been aiming to support and strengthen the national programs for TB and leprosy, activate health staff and the communities that are much prone to the two diseases. The awareness activities included 1000 students, 1000 IDPs, 80 inmates. In addition, the project provided 210 food baskets for the defaulter and resistance cases by TB and leprosy. The project has been covering 4 governorates including Aden, Aldhalea, Hadramout, Taiz for a period of 6 months, and it is funded by GLRA.




Food Security Project




Therefor,WFP is working in a partnership with FMF to contribute to reduce the risk of food insecurity for families in the governorates of Lahj, Hadramout and Taiz



Improving Food Security for IDPs



Improving Food Security for IDPs in Al Buraiqeh and Dar Sa'ad districts in Aden governorate, Tuban district in Lahj goverorate, and Al Mukha district in Taiz governorat, is a project provides emergency humanitarian assistance to IDP HHs who do not have shelter and live in collective centers by providing cash transfers assistance for six consecutive months to 255 IDPs HHs divided into the following districts:

- Dar Saad district (131 IDPs HHs)
- Al Bouriqa district (31 IDPs HHs)
- Tuban district (14 IDPs HHs)
- AI Mukha district (79 IDPs HHs)














Cash for work project aims to support several categories by providing them with financial support in exchange to re-move the garbage from the streets and neighborhood. This would create save and healthier environments.










Smallholder Agricultural Production Restoration and Enhancement Project



The objective of the project is to contribute in improving livelihoods and nutrition through restoring and increasing the use of productivity and nutrition-enhancing agricultural practices by smallholders in six districts of Lahj and Abyan governorates.

This is done by rehabilitating and developing farmers' capacities and providing them with enhanced seeds for agricultural production and distribution of goats, sheep and poultry, in addition to forage chopper machines and cereal seeds (Sorgham - millet).







Emergency agricultural livelihoods support to the most vulnerable households in Yemen Fishing component



The project aims to contribute to enhancing the livelihoods of the most vulnerable fishermen in three districts of Aden governorate (Sira, Tawahi, and Boriqa) benefit 4,890 HHs, and in two districts of Abyan governorate (Khanfer and Zingibar) benefit 4,200 HHs.

Rapid Response Mechanism Project



The ongoing conflict in the Western Coast and other locations has led to an increase in poverty among the population, especially with the ongoing displacements and interruption of basic services. The situation has recently further escalated in Hodeida after January 2019, which led to the displacement of many families. The families fleed their homes to the secure governorates seeking for food security and safety.

RRM is one of the first emergency response interventions for newly arrived IDPs.It aimes to distribute emergency kits to families who are newly displaced or in hard-to-reach areas or stranded close to the front lines. RRM is for the initial period of the onset of the emergency to cover the immediate needs for the first seven days of displacement.

FMF has been distributing emergency kits in Al Mukha and Dhubab districts during the period from July to December, funded by (WFP,OCHA,UNCIF and UNFPA)







Project to provide life-saving protection services for internally displaced persons and conflict-affected populations in Yemen




The project aims to provide life-saving protection services to internally displaced people and conflict affected populations in Yemen. The project has expanded to cover Al-Khokha, Hais, Al-Tahita, Mawzah, Al-Wazia, Ataq, Baihan, Aseelan, Al-Dhalea ', Qataba, and Al-Husain districts.


Within the framework of the protection project, FMF worked with the Danish Refugee Support Council as an implementing local partner, whereby the field team works to register displaced and war-affected families to provide cash assistance and make the necessary referrals, whether psychosocial, legal, shelter, or food support.

Yemen Communities stronger together Program



Yemen Communities stronger together (YCST) is a three-year program funded by USAID, Implemented by Global Communities, together with Field medical Foundation (FMF).

It targets three governorates (Aden, Lahj, Abyan); YCST is using Global Communities' participatory action for community enhancement (PACE) to build the capacity of community members and local leaders to develop a vision for their communites.

The purpose of YCST is to support local-level initiatives that mitigate conflict, strengthen social cohesion, promote the peaceful resolution with regard to building conflict mitigation and leadership skills for individuals, especially women and youth, through community projects that are identified by each community.

It engages the communities in an inclusive approach to identify and implement service delivery and conflict mitigation projects. In the first year, the program targeted 12 communities at 3 governorates resulting in proritizing 13 projects in water, electricity and health sectors for those targeted communities.

In an effort to enhance the response of the facilities of the care and gender-based violence centers , the Women's Center for Research and Training and the Field Medical Foundation conducted an assessment to determine the best flexibility options (TOR) for the mandates available to women and girls in Yemen, in order to assist in reducing the risks and forms of violence as a basis for a comprehensive recovery at the level of the country.
